# 4. General Body Meeting

Please plan to attend the annual General Body Meeting of ICRCC, tentatively scheduled on Sat, 19-Mar-2022 (due to COVID-19, specifics such as time | in-person or virtual, are yet to be determined). All members are invited to attend. In addition to other agenda items such as discussing past activities, expenditures, and budget, an important task at this meeting is to elect new members to the Board of Directors.

The Board consists of 15 Directors, each of whom is expected to serve for three years unless they are replacing a Director who had resigned before completing the full term of three years. This year, we need nominations for seven Directors.

Directors meet once a month to plan and organize various activities and events, as well as to oversee other aspects of the organization; regular attendance is required, since Board business cannot be conducted without a quorum. In their first meeting, Directors also elect the members of the Executive Committee, i.e., the President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer, as well as members of other committees. Directors continue in office until their successors are elected, unless they resign earlier. Whenever an event is organized by ICRCC, some Directors take the lead and others help in various ways; other interested members of the community may also take an active role.

There are seven open positions that need to be filled, and so far the following individuals have been nominated for election to the ICRCC Board of Directors:

- 6. Ajoy Roy

Several of these nominees have already served 3-year terms on the Board and would prefer if other ICRCC members would be willing to serve instead of them. # 5. India Center: Building Committee Report

Dear members of ICRCC. In our September 2021 newsletter I listed projects that need our attention. I am pleased to inform that two of the most pressing concerns have been successfully completed.

- 1. The parking lot Thanks to the contractor, parking lot was fixed just before the snow arrival. Three big holes are gone, and the parking lot looks much better. In summer, we may want to readdress remaining concerns.
- 2. HVAC system -- One persistent concern about our inability to maintain comfortable temperature in the building is taken care of. This project mainly involved attic insulation and replacement of all broken pipes. The area above the foyer was also insulated. Overall, this project (appears) has made a big difference in maintaining the temperature.

In the September 2021 newsletter, I mentioned few other projects that we wish to accomplish.

- 1. The idea of combining the two basement rooms to accommodate larger gatherings, with flexibility to partition them, if necessary. Presently, this project is on hold.
- To make the kitchen and eating areas more functional. This project is partially complete. Spearheaded by our dedicated board member, Sunil Gupta, an island has been built in the kitchen with utensils storage facility. A door to the kitchen from basement entrance area will proceed soon.
- 3. Build a covered porch just outside the current entrance to the building. This is our most ambitious addition to the building. Benefits of this addition are: e.g., in winter we can use it to hang coats, leave winter boots, and prevent cold draft of air from entering the main building; and in summer this place can be used for small gatherings as well as to manage crowd overflow. The cost of this addition is approximately \$50,000. This project is currently on hold.
- 4. Some additional projects, that we hope to accomplish soon, include securing the building by putting cameras inside and outside and covering the windows in the main hall using better quality shades.

Two of the three projects listed above are on hold due to lack of funds. As I wrote in the previous newsletter, the Building Committee proposes to embark on a fund-raising effort in the amount of \$50,000 to \$75,000. Unfortunately, things are moving at a slow pace due to waves of COVID-19 that prevents us, to our disappointment, from organizing meetings and events in the Center.

Thanks to some community members for donating money towards building improvements and maintenance after our September newsletter. We, the Building Committee, continue to appeal to community members for large and small donations for improvements and maintenance.

The building is OURS. Please suggest ideas and participate in efforts to improve the same.

# **Dr. Maheshwar Prasad Varshney**



Our long-time community member Dr. Anju Varshney's father, Dr. Maheshwar Prasad Varshney, passed away in Aligarh, India on January 19, 2022.

Dr. Varshney was born on September 22, 1928, in Aligarh. He was a part of the first Electrical Engineering graduating class of Roorkee University (now IIT Roorkee). He completed his doctorate from the Sorbonne University in Paris in 1952. He was one of the founding professors of IIT Kharagpur, the first established IIT. After that, he became Head of Electrical Engineering at Moti Lal Nehru Engineering College in Allahabad.

In the mid-sixties, he joined the United Nations as a consultant to UNESCO. He helped establish engineering colleges in Baghdad and Mosul (Iraq) as well as in Bangkok (Thailand). He also taught at Syracuse University. He retired very early, after which he led a spiritual life and established a Gita temple near Aligarh. He wrote several books on the Bhagvad Gita. He donated his ashram to ISKCON who have now built the Gita Gyan Mandir (http://www.iskconaligarh.com/) at that site.
