#### Srinivasa Ramanujan

The mathematical prodigy (or phenomenon) Ramanujan was born in Erode in South India on Thursday, December 22, 1887. His mother Komalathammal sang bhajans (devotional songs) at the temple, where she got meager offerings.

When he was just two years old he suffered an attack of small pox but fortunately he recovered completely.

Even at the tender age of ten years he was challenging his teachers. When one of the teachers stated that when a number is divided by itself the result is one, Ramanujan immediately enquired if zero divided by zero would also be one!

His mathematical powers were put to good use even when he was in school. A fairly large number of students - in different grades and different subjects - had to be assigned to various sections. This was a tedious task for the teachers. Recognizing Ramanujan's capabilities, the task was handed over to him, which he accomplished with ease.

By the time he was thirteen he had mastered S.L. Loney's trigonometry. When he was awarded a prize for mathematics at a ceremony when he was about 17, the head master introduced him to the audience as a student who deserved higher than the maximum – "he was off-the charts"!

A few years later people in the mathematics field told him that there was no one in India who could help him to continue his studies and that he should seek someone in the U.K. He wrote to three people indicating the lines on which he was working and whether they could help him Two of them showed no interest but G.R, Hardy, a great mathematician, found that he was a genius and wanted him to come to the U.K.

But there was a problem. In India travel overseas was considered as polluting and was forbidden. So he was taken to Namakkal the temple of his deity for guidance. It is said that the deity appeared in his dream and gave him permission to travel.

He boarded the ship Nevasa on March 17, 1904 and sailed to London.

He was a strict vegetarian and remained so all through his life. While in England he drank milk with added Ovaltine, only to find that some non-vegetarian component was in it. He was mortified and disappeared for a few days!

In England there were other problems. Being a strict vegetarian, he had to cook his own meals. He missed the spicy, South Indian food. Coming from the sunny South India he had to adjust to the gray, cold climate of England. Being used to the attire in India with only sandals he was not comfortable in a suit and shoes in England.

There was also the issue of racism. When Hardy proposed his name for election as a Fellow of Trinity College, one of the English Fellows responded that he would not have a "black man" as a fellow.

At this point his health declined requiring frequent hospitalizations. He was also disappointed at the rejection of the election. Prof Hardy tried other ways to get him the recognition that he deserved. He put him up for the election to the Royal Society. In 1918 Ramanujan became a Fellow of the Royal Society. He was also elected to the London Mathematical Society.

His health continued to decline and suspecting that he was suffering from Tuberculosis, Hardy suggested that he should go back to India. On March 13, 1919 he paid his last visit to Hardy and set sail to India. On January 12, 1920 he wrote his last letter to Hardy telling him that he had discovered a new type of function - mock theta function. In India his health continued to decline. Early in the morning of April 26, 1920 he fell into a coma and died that day.

In memory of this great mathematician, a Centennial Memorial Tribute is being organized in Syracuse, NY on May 2, 2020. Several well-known people - Professors George Andrews, Bruce Berndt, Ken Ono, Kavita Ramanan, and Ravi Ramakrishna have agreed to participate in the event.

The book "The Man who Knew Infinity" by Robert Kanigel is a well written biography of Ramanujan.


