
It took well over 3 decades, but it finally happened, on July 1st, 2019 around noon we signed documents to take over the ownership of a property located at 1990 Meadowbrook Drive, Syracuse, NY. This has been a dream for many and a lot of hard work with "will make it happen" attitude turned this dream into reality.

When we first made the purchase offer on this property back in April, we were \$100,000 short in our bank accounts. Back then to raise those funds seemed like a big mountain to climb. But we underestimated the generosity of our community members. We didn't just raise enough funds, but we beat our goal by almost \$3,000. In addition, we also received some major commitments towards future maintenance. We sincerely want to thank all those who donated and worked hard to make this a reality.

Now that we have our place, the hard work really begins to maintain the facility. We are going to need all types of help from everybody with various skills. Types of help we would need might include;

- Opening /closing the facility
