
ICRCC celebrated Gandhi Jayanti on Sunday, October 1 at our India Center. A variety of programs were organized to celebrate this day.

The program started with Sarva Dharma Prarthana, followed by recitation of Gandhiji's favorite bhajans.

Dr. Ashutosh recalled his experience in the Sabarmati Ashram, and talked about how Gandhiji's approach to the freedom struggle resulted in independent India being able to maintain a cordial relationship with the UK instead of hostilities.

As has been the tradition for the last few years, Gandhiji graced us with his presence again this year.

The highlight of the event was the debut of a fictional play, "Gandhiji meets Netaji in The Good Place," written by Chilukuri Mohan involving a conversation between Gandhiji and Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose – the audience got a ringside seat to this very interesting dialog.

Sarod and Tabla Concert

On October 13, 2023, ICRCC hosted a wonderful concert by Swarnendu Mandal and Ritvik Yaparpalvi at the India Center.

Swarnendu, a sarod virtuoso based in Kolkata, is a scholar at the ITC Sangeet Research Academy, and has been a student of Pandit Buddhadev Dasgupta, who belongs to the <u>Senia Shahjahanpur Gharana</u>. He has numerous acclaimed performances to his credit. Swarnendu performs regularly on All India Radio and Doordarshan (Indian TV); he has performed in Europe and more recently at the G20 Summit. He is 23 years old, and has bachelor's and master's degrees from Jadavpur University.

Playing the Tabla was another young prodigy, Ritvik Yaparpalvi, a student of Pandit Nayan Ghosh of Mumbai, from the <u>Farrukhabad Gharana</u>. Ritvik has been playing tabla from the age of 3, and is currently a college student at the Boston Conservatory, learning other percussion instrument styles.

The concert began with a short introduction to the <u>Sarod</u> and <u>Tabla</u>. The artistes then enchanted the audience by playing Raag *Bageshri*. After a brief intermission, they played the upbeat *Manjh Khamaaj* Raag, transporting the audience to a happy state of mind. They concluded by playing Rabindranath Tagore's famous "Ekla Chalo" song, a favorite of Mahatma Gandhi.

It was an amazing performance by the two young artistes, who coordinated beautifully with each other even though they had never played together before. This was also Swarnendu's first performance in the USA. Based on what we witnessed, both artistes will scale new pinnacles of accomplishments in years to come. About 70 people attended the concert and enjoyed the exceptional talents of the gifted musicians. The concert was greatly appreciated by all, and we look forward to more such events in our ICRCC building in the near future.

Lav Varshney


Lav Varshney, a son of Pramod and the late Anju Varshney from Fayetteville, recently completed his term as a White House Fellow for 2022-23, where he served on the National Security Council staff.

The White House Fellowship is often called the nation's most prestigious service and leadership program – with significant influence on the nation's policy-making in science and technology.



He graduated from Fayetteville-Manlius High School, holds a B.S. degree in electrical and computer engineering from Cornell University, and a Ph.D. degree from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Lav is a professor of engineering, computer science, neuroscience, and digital agriculture at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign. He is also CEO of Kocree, Inc. (a music co-creativity startup), chief scientist of Ensaras, Inc. (a wastewater + AI startup), and works with Brookhaven National Laboratory on computing for national security. He has published widely in core areas of information theory and artificial intelligence (AI), as well as applications in critical infrastructure, music, food, sustainability, public health, and medicine.

Remembering Kishor Kanabar



It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of Mr Kishor Kanabar on 12 Oct 2023; he was born on 26 Oct 1950.

Kishor had a heart of gold that was evident in the community work he did throughout his life. Apart from dedicating a major portion of his life for BAPS temple and community, he was also an ICRCC board member for a number of years, including a few years on the Executive Committee.

Kishor was very diligent and sincere, and was instrumental in the collaboration between ICRCC and the Gujarati community to hold highly successful Navratri events. He always volunteered for different events and donated time and food whenever possible.

Family and education were very important to Kishor. This was his primary motivation to leave India and then Africa and come to the US. He wanted to ensure his children, Anand and Mishal, had the best possible education and upbringing. Kishor and his wife, Harsha,

sacrificed a lot to ensure their children had the best chance at a great life.

The summer of 2006 was a turning point for Kishor's entire family. Due to a severe allergic reaction his liver failed within a week. All signs pointed to him dying that week due to his condition. But with a combination of divine intervention and modern medicine, he received a liver transplant in less than 2 days after being on the list. Doctors said he only had hours left by the time he received the transplant.


While today, tomorrow, and the foreseeable future will be sad, his family felt truly blessed that they had 17 years with him that they weren't supposed to have.

Kishor loved his grand-daughters, and it was one of the last things he wanted to see before he passed. They were his pride and joy, and he will forever be with them. One of his 2-year old granddaughters said, "Papa went above to see God. But I will always have him in my heart and mind."

Kishor had many passions, including football and golf. With football, the big event he loved hosting every year was the Super Bowl. It was his event. And he loved being the antagonist in the group. He went as far as rooting for the Patriots just to spice up the viewing party.

Kishor will be remembered as a wonderful human being who gave selflessly to the community.
