ICRCC – from its genesis to today

In 1970, there lived a handful of Indians in Syracuse. Although they met at each other's homes, their main social activity was to watch a Bollywood film in Gifford Auditorium of Syracuse University, whenever available.

In 1968, Professor Robert Crane, born in India, a scholar of Indian History, joined Syracuse University. He was influential in starting Indian Studies programs in many universities across the US, including at Syracuse University. By the end of 1970s, he and other like-minded individuals felt that Syracuse lacked an organization that could promote Indian culture, art, religion and languages and instill Indian values in our children.

To get to this goal, meetings continued to take place among influential individuals, such as Umesh Patil, Kumar Ashutosh, Gurnek Singh, Mansukh Shah, Jit Turakhia, Yatish Goyal, Ram Choudhary, Narendra Bhandari, Ramesh Modi, and many more, to discuss the formation of such an organization.

Finally, after multiple discussions over the course of a few years, the most significant development took place in early summer of 1984. During this meeting, at Yatish Goyal's residence, which was attended by the above and many more individuals, concrete steps were taken, such as resolving that the organization will encompass all religions (Hindu, Sikh, Muslim, Christian, etc.).

Thus, India Community Religious and Cultural Center (ICRCC), a nonprofit organization, was founded in 1984, to bring together Asian-Indians of Central New York to promote, celebrate and appreciate their common bonds, culture, religion and social customs. Dr Umesh Patil was elected as the first president of the organization.

The Festival of India, together with an art exhibition was the first program organized by ICRCC in Everson museum, and it was a huge success. The association organized two anchor programs – Spring Festival and Diwali and also celebrated Republic Day, Independence Day, Navroz, and Christmas on a regular basis. In addition, jointly with other Syracuse University organizations, it offered high quality music, dance, and drama programs in the 1990s.

For almost 40 years ICRCC has been a vibrant organization holding many events and programs such as music, dance, festivals, plays, scholarly talks and seminars to highlight India's rich art and cultural heritage. ICRCC has also co-sponsored numerous community programs, and has participated in several philanthropic activities, such as donations to relief funds – Twin Towers, Hurricane Katrina, Golisano pediatric hospital wing at Upstate, Rescue Mission, scholarships to deserving high school students, and COVID-19 Community Support Fund (CNYCF).

ICRCC moved into its new home at 1990 Meadowbrook Drive in July 2019. Acquiring its own home was a significant milestone for ICRCC. The strategic central location, with ample parking, proximity to major intersections is very convenient and appealing to our patrons. Consequently, ICRCC now hosts many of its events at this venue, further enhancing the experience of attendees.


Throughout the year, ICRCC enriches the broader Syracuse area with a diverse range of cultural, religious, and educational programs. These include the celebrations of major Indian festivals such as Diwali, Holi, and Christmas, as well as Indian Independence Day, Republic Day, and Gandhi Jayanti. ICRCC also partners with Onondaga County Resource Recovery Agency (OCRRA) for Earth Day cleanup activities, demonstrating its commitment to environmental responsibility.

ICRCC works collaboratively with other nonprofit organizations beyond the Indian community. ICRCC operates entirely on the dedication and passion of its volunteers, including its Board of Directors. ICRCC welcomes every individual or group to volunteer and/or attend its programs; irrespective of their background.

ICRCC celebrated its 40th anniversary in 2024, a significant milestone that reflects the organization's enduring impact and unwavering commitment to serving the community.
