# Music Event celebrating Mohammed Rafi's Birth Centenary

On January 18, 2025, ICRCC organized a celebration of the birth centenary of the renowned Bollywood playback singer, Mohammed Rafi (Dec. 24, 1924 – July 31, 1980). Several community members participated by singing upbeat and romantic songs made famous by Rafi, using Karaoke tracks of his recordings.

The evening was enjoyed by an audience of about 80 people, and was particularly successful, thanks to Mr. Navneet Kharbanda from Columbus (Ohio), the main featured singer at the event.

Other singers from the Syracuse Indian community included Lakshmi Kavety, Rajiv Kumar, Chilukuri Mohan, Jitendra Patel, Amar Swarnkar, Pramod Varshney, Falguni Vora, Rajiv Vora, as well as students Sahana Anand and Venkata Yashwanth Yellapragada.

In addition to many solos, a few duets were also performed, as well as everybody's favorite: "ramayya vastaavayya" involving several singers.



### Republic Day



On the 26th of January, 1950, the Constitution of India came into effect as the governing document of the Republic of India, following the work of the Constituent Assembly since 1946; the first draft of the constitution had been prepared by Benegal Narsing Rau, and the Drafting Committee was chaired by Bhimrao Ambedkar. 26th January was chosen because of the first proclamation of "Purna Swaraj" by the Indian National Congress in December 1929, declaring January 26, 1930 to be the day of Independence, beyond dominion status subservient to the British monarch.

Along with Indians and those of Indian origin living throughout the world, we in Central New York also celebrated the 76th Republic Day of India on 26th January 2025. ICRCC organized this event which was held in the India Center in Syracuse. The event was very successful and was attended by about 100 community members. In addition to short inspirational speeches by ICRCC members, we also enjoyed a cultural program, with melodious songs and beautiful solo and group dance performances by children and adults. Finally, we enjoyed a social hour, snacks and tea prepared and provided by several ICRCC volunteers.

# Spellbound Journey

I am Simran Sanders, an incoming Freshman at Jamesville-Dewitt High School and recently competed in the 2025 Centennial Scripps National Spelling Bee. This was my third consecutive year competing as the Central New York Post Standard Regional Champion. The Central New York region stretches from Syracuse up to Oswego, West to Auburn, South to Cortland, and East to Utica.

In general, the Scripps Bee starts in the Fall of each year with more than 11 million students from several countries competing at the classroom or school level. Through a tournament of school, district, and regional written and oral bees, those numbers are pared down to about 240 Scripps National Spelling Bee qualifiers in late May of each year. En route to nationals this



year, I was able to answer approximately 80/80 written and oral spelling and vocabulary questions correctly.

I consistently placed in the top 60 at Nationals for the past three years, including this year's competition. JDMS Principal Andy Eldridge recently said this of my Spelling Bee run:

"Simran has been a spelling bee force representing Central New York on a national level for the past three years. I can speak for the entire school when I say Simran's dedication and work ethic serve as a fantastic example for J-D Middle School and the community as a whole."

I greatly benefited from the process and challenge of preparing for spelling bees since 5th grade. In that year, I placed second at CNY Bee. At first, I was upset to finish one spot out of Nationals, but eventually, I took the result as motivation to work harder toward a stronger base of word knowledge.

Now that I have competed in my last bee, I look forward to growing my horizons in other ways through science and math enrichment.

#### Mahakumbh Mela 2025

This year India witnessed an event that happens every 144 years – Maha Kumbh. It was held in Prayagraj, Uttar Pradesh from January 13 to February 26, 2025. This was attended by 660 million people and few of our community friends were lucky to attend it all the way from Central New York. Let's hear from them.

#### Mona Khurana's journey

I cautiously treaded the river waters in Prayagraj as I waded deeper. In those stony beds, a long and soft object slowly wrapped around my ankles that were deeply submerged in the murky waters. I jumped up nervously. "Keep moving till the water reaches your shoulder" yelled a pilgrim ahead. As I untangled the bright red chunni around my leg, delicate offerings of flowers, leaves, diyas, and even a vessel or two twirled around me before flowing away. Mustering courage I pinched my nostrils tight and finally ducked in the deep end. The icy coldness struck my head with force and caused me to fall backwards. Quite apprehensive, my next few attempts were simply leaning over to wet my hair and perhaps console myself that I performed the Snan. Seeing my futile efforts, a fellow pilgrim took pity on me and offered to hold my hands while I performed the ritual correctly. This time I succeeded and the next few dips were perfect as I immersed my whole body, mind, and soul into the holy rivers. My chills turned into a comforting warmth as sounds of "Har Har Mahadev" filled my ears. Around me, the enthusiasm was contagious as pilgrims with folded hands, half submerged, chanted in unison.



His statement was like a light bulb in my head. Travelling solo to Prayagraj, I paid no heed to the cautionary tales of my relatives in the U.S. and India anymore. The heavy dust, the strange sadhus, the massive crowds, and the constant noise somehow all kept me at peace. My resilience grew multifold as I battled through the daily gridlock to get to my destination along with those bright faces from all walks of life. I witnessed thousands walk and sleep with devotion on the cold hard grounds every day and felt humbled and grateful for all the almighty has given to me and my family. I will always feel proud and thankful to join even a small part of this ancient and immense spiritual tradition of Sanatan Dharma which has been around for thousands of years.

#### Deepali Sharma's journey

Kumbh - a spiritual journey shared with thousands of others, family and strangers. With feelings of gratitude toward life and the universe, I feel blessed to have had this privilege to participate with so many devotees, together in humility for the holy dip at the Sangam. From the tent city organizers to the rickshaw and motorcycle drivers, the police force, the tika applicators and shoe keepers at temples, everyone had one purpose - to make the event a peaceful and humbling experience for all. This tolerant and giving face of humanity captured the essence of the Maha Kumbh Mela.
