Shashank Concert Raises Money for India Flood Relief

ICRCC sponsored a classical flute and tabla concert on September 29 at Onondaga Community College to help raise money for Uttarkhand flood relief efforts. From June 14-17, 2013, the Uttarkhand state in northern India experienced severe flooding — about 375% higher than the benchmark for a typical monsoon. The heavy rains and flooding created extreme environmental conditions: rapidly melting glaciers and mountain snow, overflowing rivers, broken dams, mudslides and landslides. Entire communities in this Himalayan region were destroyed.
